This last verse still moves me. Just like the stirring of the Christmas cake mixture, let us enfold the gift of Christmas into our hearts. Whatever our situation: enough money to pay our bills or not; working or retired; living with others or alone; bereaved; with plans for a way forward or not; security, directly affected by war, trauma, grief or poverty or watching it on T.V., we all have ups and downs. During Advent we bring to God ourselves, our spiritual gifts, our time, our life experience... and our hearts. Christmas brings hope.

So, amongst all the busyness, Advent is a time to slow down and savour the season. I 'll finish with the poem Pacemaker by Andree Heaton \sim

Learn to sit still, Watch fire glowing. Instead of dashing Seeing, knowing. Shut the noise out, Hear wind blowing. Instead of rushing Breathing, flowing. Stand in one place, Feel pace slowing. Instead of racing Being, growing.




